

Another New Role for eKindy Queensland

eKindy Queensland has been selected to trial the provision of Kindergarten in the Lady Cilento Children's Hospital and The Mater Children's Private Hospital in Brisbane. Two of our teachers – Di Ellwood and David Saunders - will be working on the wards

from Term 3 with the kindergarten-aged children who have been hospitalized. This is a wonderful opportunity to provide rich learning experiences to allow children to continue their learning journey in hospital.

eKindy Queensland Pod Pilot

The Department of Education has put in place a pilot until the end of 2018 for supporting our eKindy Queensland Pods. BushKids has been appointed as the third party provider to look after the business side of operations – employment of facilitators, insurances and risk assessments. Funds have been released to them and they will use it to pay the facilitators for 6.5 hours per week per pod of up to four children. The eKindy Queensland teachers are responsible for the pedagogical operation of the pods. There are currently 18 Pods in Central Queensland, Darling Downs and the South West.
